At Vespers

At "Lord, I have cried...", six stichera in Tone VI, special melody "Having placed all their hope...":

Rejoice, O Alaska, / exult, O North America, / for a lamp bearing the light of the Sun of *Righteousness* / has gloriously appeared in thee. / Father Jacob wise in God, / who didst enlighten the northern lands with the joyous message of the *gospel of Christ*, / now shines forth in all the world. // Therefore we sing praises to Christ who is wonderful in his saints.

O you <u>love</u>rs of the feasts, / let us hasten together to honor the righteous <u>Jac</u>ob, / who poured out his <u>life</u> for the Church. / In countless sorrows and af<u>flict</u>ions, / and in pain and deprivation, he bore all as the A<u>post</u>les of old. / We celebrate thy memory, O chosen <u>saint</u> of God, // as a help to those in di<u>stress</u>, O father <u>Jac</u>ob.

Like the patriarch Jacob of old, / our holy father Jacob fled from the comforts of this life / and was granted a vision: / a ladder from heaven appeared in the wilds of Alaska, / on which the people might ascend to God./ With patience and love, and the labor of many years, / he obtained the longed-for Bride: / the holy Church of Christ, / brilliant in his own native land. / Therefore we cry aloud to him: / entreat the Lord for us, O holy father Jacòb, // that our souls may be saved.

The holy Prophet Moses raised up a tabernacle on Mount <u>Hor</u>eb, / and there he spoke with God face to face as one might <u>speak</u> with a friend. /

Our righteous Jacob pitched a tent in the Alaskan <u>wilderness</u>, / where he celebrated the <u>Mysteries</u> of Christ // unto the sanctification of the <u>faithful</u>.

And two stichera in Tone II, Alaskan

<u>Born</u> on the remote island of <u>At</u>ka, / thou didst become a living <u>wit</u>ness for Christ, / not by the <u>glor</u>ious path of <u>martyrdom</u>, / but by <u>hum</u>bly accepting the call to the <u>priest</u>hood: / preaching, healing, counseling, <u>pray</u>ing to God, // and tending thy flock for forty <u>years</u> in the Alaskan <u>wild</u>erness.

<u>Miss</u>ionary teacher of the Atkan <u>A-</u>le-uts, / translating the scriptures and <u>founding</u> schools. / Thou didst <u>take</u> up the missionary efforts of the holy hierarch <u>Inn</u>ocent, / <u>foll</u>owing his example: / journeying to remote lands, bringing the Gospel to the Yup'iks and Atha<u>bascans</u>, / <u>baptizing</u> and <u>guiding</u> them / to <u>love</u> and to <u>unity</u> in Christ, // sanctifying them, and be<u>stowing</u> <u>blessings</u> of <u>peace</u>.

Glory..., in Tone III:

Today the assembly of the faithful rejoices in the <u>memory</u> / of our <u>holy</u> father <u>Jacob</u>, / <u>boast</u> of Alaska and <u>glory</u> of priests, / wise <u>preach</u>er of the <u>Gospel</u> of Christ, / sure <u>pill</u>ar of the Church, fellow citizen with the <u>angels</u>, / <u>equal</u> to the Apostles and <u>prophets</u>: / O <u>holy</u> father <u>Jacob</u>, // entreat Christ our <u>God</u> that our <u>souls</u> may be <u>saved</u>.

Entrance. **Prokimenon** of the Day. Readings:

THE READING FROM THE WISDOM OF SOLOMON (5:15-6:3)

The righteous live forevermore; their reward also is with the Lord, and the care of them is with the Most High. Therefore shall they receive a glorious kingdom, and a beautiful crown from the Lord's hand: for with his right

hand shall he cover them, and with his arm shall he protect them. And his zeal will take armor, and he will arm his creation for vengeance upon his enemies. He will vest in the armor of truth, and his helmet shall be judgment without respect of persons. He shall take up the invincible shield of holiness; he shall sharpen his wrath for a sword, and the world shall fight with him against the mad ones. Then shafts of lightning shall strike down from the clouds, as from a bow well aimed, and shall fly to their mark. And hailstones of wrath shall be cast down as stones, and the waters of the sea shall rage against them, and the floods shall drown them terribly. A mighty wind shall rise against them, and like a storm shall blow them away; thus iniquity shall lay waste the whole earth, and ill-dealing shall overthrow the thrones of the mighty. Hear, therefore, O ye kings, and understand; learn, ye judges of the ends of the earth. Give ear, ye that rule the people, and are proud in the multitude of nations: For power is given you from the Lord, and strength cometh of the Highest.

THE READING FROM THE FIRST GENERAL EPISTLE OF THE HOLY APOSTLE JOHN THE THEOLOGIAN (1 John 4:1-6)

Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world. Hereby know ye the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesseth that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is of God: And every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world. Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them: because greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world. They are of the world: therefore speak they of the world, and the world heareth them. We are of God: he that knoweth

God heareth us; he that is not of God heareth not us. Hereby know we the spirit of truth, and the spirit of error.

THE READING FROM THE FIRST GENERAL EPISTLE OF THE HOLY APOSTLE JOHN THE THEOLOGIAN (1 John 4:20-5:5)

If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar: for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen? And this commandment have we from him, That he who loveth God love his brother also. Whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is born of God: and every one that loveth him that begat loveth him also that is begotten of him. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God, and keep his commandments. For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments: and his commandments are not grievous. For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith. Who is he that overcometh the world, but he that believeth that Jesus is the Son of God?

O di*vine*ly-wise husbandman, thou didst not <u>lab</u>or in vain, / for power from the Most High was <u>granted</u> to thee, / that a <u>new</u> and fruitful <u>vine</u>yard / would appear in the Alaskan <u>wild</u>erness. / Watch over us also, O father <u>Jacob</u>,// that by thine intercessions <u>Christ</u> may <u>save</u> our <u>souls</u>!

Most-holy Lady Theotokos, <u>Virgin</u>, / Mary full of grace, <u>hope</u> of all mankind, / and help of our holy father <u>Jacob</u>; / receive the supplications of those in af<u>flic</u>tion / and beseech thy <u>Son</u> and our Gòd // to grant peace to <u>those</u> who honor thee!

Aposticha, Tone 8

Rejoice, O righteous <u>Ja</u>cob, / who didst illumine A<u>las</u>ka / with the <u>lamp</u> of thy <u>preaching</u>, / patiently guiding the people out of <u>dark</u>ness / into the light of the <u>know</u>ledge of God! / Now, dwelling with the <u>ang</u>els in unap<u>proach</u>able light, // pray for us that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!

Verse: Giving, he has dispersed to the poor; righteousness is his for all ages.

Rejoice, O father Jacob, / equal of the Apostles and dweller in the wilderness,/ example of humility and piety, / patient contender in tribulation, / pillar of Orthodoxy in the New World! // Entreat the Holy Trinity on behalf of those who celebrate thy memory!

Verse: In steadfast heart, he shall never fear.

Rejoice, O holy <u>Ja</u>cob, / for by grace thou hast become like <u>Ja</u>cob of old, / a <u>fath</u>er of many <u>na</u>tions! / O joy of the Yukon and <u>Kusk</u>okwim, / and the Aleutian <u>Isl</u>ands, // pray to Christ God that our <u>souls</u> may be <u>saved</u>!

At "The Lord is God...", the troparion of the saint, in Tone IV (Alaskan):

Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion in Tone IV

The mystery hidden from eternity, / and unknown to the angels, / through thee, O Theotokos, is revealed to those on earth: / God made flesh in a union without confusion, / and willingly accepting the Cross for us, / by which he resurrected the first-formed man, // and saved our souls from death.

After the first chanting of the Psalter, these sessional hymns, in Tone I:

As a servant of the Master of all, thou wast a servant of thy flock, O holy father. By thy teaching thou brought them the light of knowledge, and by water and the Spirit, holy Illumination, O righteous and godly father Jacob, faithful priest and preacher of grace. We honor thee with hymns of praise, O blessed one and friend of Christ.

Glory...now and ever..., Theotokion, in Tone I

O pure Virgin Theotokos, intercessor and protector of the faithful, deliver from all calamity and sorrow, and from all violent assault those who put their trust in thee, and through thy supplications save our souls.

After the second chanting of the Psalter, these sessional hymns, in Tone IV:

In the depths of the Alaskan wilderness thou didst offer up prayers to the Lord. By binding the wounds of ancient enmities thou didst reconcile all to Christ and one another. O heavenly intercessor and true priest, Jacob our father, pray to Christ for us who honor thee.

Glory...now and ever... Theotokion, Tone IV:

Accept the entreaties, O Virgin, of those who run to thy protection. Never cease to pray fervently to the lover of mankind that he will deliver your servants from all harm.

Polyeleos, and magnification:

We magnify. / O holy father <u>Jac</u>ob, / and we <u>hon</u>or thy <u>holy memory</u>, / for thou enlightenest the peoples of A<u>lask</u>a, / and thou dost <u>pray</u> to <u>Christ</u> our <u>God</u> for <u>us</u>.

Verse: Hear this, all peoples; give ear all inhabitants of the world.

Sessional Hymn, Tone IV

From thy youth thou didst take up thy cross, deny thyself, and follow Christ. Thou didst stand before the altar of God, glorifying thy master and his most-pure Mother. Therefore God has highly exalted thee, bestowing on thee abundant gifts, O blessed father Jacob.

O most-pure Virgin, thou gavest birth to the eternal God. Together with our holy father Jacob, beseech thy Son and our God to grant us remission of sins and amendment of life before the end, O only all-lauded one.

Thy flock thou didst instruct, O father Jacob, teaching them the doctrine of the Holy Trinity, the divine unity of three persons, God one in essence and undivided, ever adored by the orthodox peoples of Alaska.

Ode 5

Irmos: Why hast thou <u>cast</u> me from thy presence, O never-<u>set</u>ting light? / And why hast hostile <u>dark</u>ness encompassed me in my re<u>pent</u>ance? / But turn me <u>back</u>, I en<u>treat</u> thee, // and guide my steps toward the <u>light</u> of thy com<u>mand</u>ments.

Piously fulfilling thy divine office, thou didst draw near to holy things with a pure mind. As a blameless minister of grace, thou didst bring honor to the priesthood, O most righteous and holy father Jacob.

Called by the grace of God, thou didst abolish the lawlessness of the impious; by the grace of thy words, like a river of living water, thou thawest the frozen hearts of pagan peoples.

Ode VI

Irmos: I will pour <u>out</u> my prayer be<u>fore</u> the Lord; / I will make <u>known</u> to him my <u>sor</u>row, / for my <u>soul</u> is filled with afflictions and my life has *drawn* <u>near</u> to hell; / and like <u>Jon</u>ah I will pray: // O *God*, raise me <u>up</u> from cor<u>rupt</u>ion.

O trumpet of the Spirit of God, Alaska resounds with thy teachings. The saving commandments of Christ are set forth, inscribed not on tablets of stone, but written on the hearts of men who glorify thee, O father Jacob.

Exchanging the security of hearth and home for the dangers of the wilderness, thou wast revealed as a great merchant securing for thyself and countless others, Christ the Lord, the priceless pearl.

Standing by the river's edge and offering baptism to all who believed, thou revealest the precious Cross of Christ as a trophy of peace and salvation, and the source of many miracles.

The Word of God, O Lady, has shown you to be a wondrous and life-giving fount, welling up with healing water for all who cry to thee: "Most-holy Theotokos, save us!"

Kontakion, Tone 3

O <u>holy</u> father <u>Jacob</u>, / teacher of the <u>know</u>ledge of God, / thou didst re<u>veal</u> thy love for thy <u>people</u>, / taking up thy cross and <u>fol</u>lowing Christ, / enduring hardships like the <u>Apos</u>tle Paul. / Pray on our behalf to <u>Christ</u> our God // to <u>grant</u> us great <u>mer</u>cy!

Ikos: Hearing the voice of the Savior, O saint, thou didst wisely follow him to the wilderness. Taking no thought for the comforts of life, thou was granted heavenly grace, wisdom, and understanding. We ask thee to send down those same gifts on those who praise thee, O righteous one, and pray on our behalf to Christ our God to grant us great mercy.

Ode 7

Irmos: The <u>Children</u> of Ju<u>de</u>a, / who <u>dwelt</u> of old in <u>Bab</u>ylon, / trampled <u>und</u>erfoot the flames of the <u>furn</u>ace / by their <u>faith</u> in the <u>Trin</u>ity, // as they *sang*: <u>Bless</u>ed art thou, O <u>God</u> of our <u>fath</u>ers!

Resplendent with the grace of God and radiant with the Holy Spirit, thou art a bright and shining star enlightening all Alaska, and illumining all who sing unto our God: Blessed art thou, O God of our fathers!

O dwelling place of God Most High and ornament of virtues, thou dost beautify the Church of Christ. In awe, we sinners join with thee in song unto our God: Blessed art thou, O God of our fathers!

The Savior appointed thee, like the Apostles of old, to teach all people and bring them unto himself, so that with thee they might also sing: Blessed are thou, O God of our fathers!

The holy Apostle James, the brother of the Lord, declared that the fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much for the healing of mankind. Therefore the entreaties of our righteous father Jacob, aided by thy supplications, O Lady, bring us health and salvation.

Steadfast witness of the truth and marvelous instructor in the faith, golden-tongued teacher of the Church, intercede for us to Christ our God, that we also may delight in His commandments.

We celebrate thy memory, O father Jacob, in joy and gladness, for thou art a helper of the weak. And we call upon thee in faith: Help us in afflictions, O friend of Christ!

You now behold the glory of the Lord and the brightness of God's holy ones. Do not forget us, O holy father Jacob. Beseech the Lord and lover of mankind to grant remission of sins and eternal life to us who honor thee.

Thou alone, O Theotokos, art the protectress of the Christian race. By thine intercessions, O Lady, lead us always on the path of piety, that saving, straight, and narrow way.

The Bering <u>Sea</u> is <u>warmed</u> today; / the Arctic night is il<u>lum</u>ined. / Rivers, <u>is</u>lands, tundra, and <u>forest lands</u>; / <u>mountains</u>, volcanoes, and <u>glac</u>iers resound / with the hymns of Alaska's native <u>peoples</u> / and all Orthodox <u>Christ</u>ians through <u>out</u> the world // glorifying our <u>hum</u>ble father <u>Jac</u>ob.

<u>Friend</u> and co-worker of the holy hierarch <u>Inn</u>ocent, / thou didst continue his apostolic labors in the Aleutian <u>Is</u>lands / and en<u>light</u>ened the peoples of A<u>lask</u>a. / By thy <u>prayers</u> thou didst sanctify the waters of mighty

<u>rivers</u>, / and brought reconciliation between <u>en</u>emies of old. / By preaching repentance and for <u>giveness of sins</u>, / thou didst <u>bring</u> them to the <u>Church</u> of Christ / as a shepherd gathers his <u>sheep</u> into a flock. / O <u>Jac</u>ob our <u>father</u>, // pray for unity in the <u>Church</u> and great <u>mercy</u> for our souls!

The prophet <u>Jac</u>ob saw a ladder uniting earth and <u>heav</u>en; / our father Jacob raised a tent in the wilderness where heaven was <u>present</u> on earth. / The great <u>Mos</u>es raised his staff over the Red Sea, and led the Israelites out of bondage to <u>Pharaoh</u>; / father <u>Jac</u>ob raised the Precious Cross by the Yukon <u>River</u> / and led the Alaskan peoples out of bondage to the <u>en</u>emy, / <u>calling</u> them to repentance as he baptized them in the <u>waters</u>. // Let us sing the <u>praises</u> of God's <u>mercy</u>.
